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

Overhead Transmission Lines

Unison Networks' overhead 33kV transmission lines traverse the park and in several places are a significant constraint (e.g., in relation to the realignment of Taipo Stream, configuration of playing fields, tree planting, etc.). To be able to fully realise the development as proposed in the Master Plan, the poles need to removed and the overhead lines relocated underground.

At the time of preparing the 2013 Master Plan, Napler City Council had discussions with Unison to gain an understanding of the issues involved, and the costs and timing to undertake this work.

Electricity Substation

A Unison Networks electrical substation is located in the eastern part of the site; the 33kV overhead transmission lines feed into the substation. As this area has yet to be developed, the proposed layout has incorporated the substation into the overall design, It will sit in an area of treed open space at the edge of the Northern Sports Hub between the sportsflets and the future stages of Parklands subdivision



Total Project Cost

• The undergrounding project cost is **\$2.57 million** estimated for August 2025.

Budget Shortfall

The current budget is \$1.29 million, creating a shortfall of \$1.28 million.

Funding Options

 Options include reallocating funds from future projects or loan funding the deficit separately.








Delivery Trend

• 2024/25 shows the strongest capital delivery in recent years. Although budgets were not fully utilised, the delivery rate improved compared to 2022/23 and 2023/24.

Lift in Delivery

 The percentage of the budget delivered in 2024/25 rose to around 70%, the highest of the past three years. This confirms progress in closing the gap between planned and actual delivery.





- Overall, spending was well managed across programmes with balanced delivery.

Projects exceeding \$500,000 in year-end capital expenditure are considered large-scale and significant.


